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A/B Testing Fundamentals

A/B testing (split testing) is the process of comparing two versions of a webpage to determine which performs better. For eCommerce, 'better' typically means higher conversion rate, higher average order value, or more revenue per visitor.

Before running any test, you need: sufficient traffic (minimum 1,000 visitors per variant per week), a clear hypothesis, a primary success metric, and patience to reach statistical significance (95% confidence level).

High-Impact Tests: Quick Wins

These tests typically require minimal development effort but can deliver 5-20% conversion uplift. Start here.

- Add-to-Cart button copy: 'Add to Cart' vs 'Add to Bag' vs 'Buy Now'
- CTA button color contrast against page background
- Product image count: 4 images vs 6+ images
- Price display format: '\$99' vs '\$99.00' vs 'From \$99'
- Social proof placement: above vs below the fold
- Free shipping threshold messaging on product pages
- Urgency messaging: 'Only 3 left' vs no scarcity indicator
- Product description format: paragraph vs bullet points
- Review display: show photo reviews first vs chronological
- Navigation: mega menu vs simple dropdown

Medium-Impact Tests: PDP Optimization

These tests require some design or development work but target the highest-value page on your store: the product detail page.

- Sticky add-to-cart bar on scroll

- Product video vs static images
- Size guide presentation: popup vs inline
- Recommendation engine placement: below PDP vs sidebar
- Trust badge design and placement variations
- Variant selector style: dropdown vs swatches
- Payment installment messaging prominence
- Product bundling vs individual selling
- Review summary format: stars vs percentage
- Mobile PDP layout: image gallery style

Advanced Tests: Funnel Optimization

These tests require more significant development effort but can have the largest revenue impact by optimizing the entire purchase funnel.

- Homepage hero: product-focused vs lifestyle imagery
- Collection page layout: grid vs list view
- Search results ranking algorithm
- Cart page: upsell recommendations vs clean cart
- Checkout: single-page vs multi-step
- Post-purchase upsell offers
- Email popup timing: immediate vs 30-second delay
- Free shipping progress bar placement
- Category page filtering: sidebar vs horizontal filters
- Mobile navigation: hamburger vs bottom tab bar

Statistical Significance & Sample Sizes

Running tests without adequate sample sizes leads to false conclusions. Use this guide to determine how long to run each test.

For a test with 2% baseline conversion rate detecting a 10% relative improvement (2.0% to 2.2%), you need approximately 39,000 visitors per variant at 95% confidence. For a 20% relative improvement, you need approximately 10,000 visitors per variant.

General rule: never end a test before 2 full business weeks, regardless of early results. Weekend and weekday shopping patterns differ significantly, and cutting tests short leads to unreliable conclusions.

- Google Optimize (free, basic): Good for simple page-level tests
- Convert.com (\$299+/mo): Full-featured, Shopify-optimized
- VWO (\$199+/mo): Visual editor with heatmaps
- ABTasty (\$399+/mo): Enterprise-grade with AI recommendations
- Shopify's native Split Testing API: For developers building custom tests
